The Short Answer

Here's the verdict.

DIY Umrah is often best for experienced, flexible travellers. Think: couples, repeat pilgrims, people who can change dates, and those happy to solve problems on the go.

Package Umrah is often best for first-timers, families, and anyone who wants less stress. It's also best when you need clear protection and support if plans change.

And the honest bit? Sometimes DIY is cheaper. Sometimes it isn't. The price gap can vanish fast once you add visa fees, transfers, train tickets, and "small" extras.

If you're still unsure, keep reading. We'll show you a real line-by-line table.

What DIY Umrah Actually Involves

DIY sounds simple.

In real life, it's a list of jobs. And each job has time, rules, and risk. Here's what "book Umrah yourself" really means for UK travellers in the 2026 Umrah season.

1) Visa: Nusuk, eVisa, or waiver routes

This is where many DIY plans start.

For most British passport holders, the process is usually online. But the route can differ based on your passport, your trip length, and current Saudi rules. And rules can change mid-season.

Time estimate (DIY): 30–90 minutes if all goes well. More if you hit an error.

Common DIY pain points we see:

- Name order issues (especially double-barrel names).
- Passport scan quality problems.
- Wrong visa/entry type chosen.
- Insurance add-ons you didn't expect at checkout.

2) Flights: finding the deal is the easy part

Flights can make or break your budget.

In our experience, DIY travellers do well when they can fly mid-week, avoid school holidays, and accept longer routes. But if you need specific dates, the “DIY savings” often shrink.

Time estimate (DIY): 1–3 hours to compare properly. More if you're travelling in peak months.

3) Hotels: Makkah is not like booking any other city

This part surprises people.

In Makkah, two hotels can look “close” on a map. But one is a flat 8-minute walk. The other is a steep route with lifts, tunnels, and crowds. That matters after Tawaf (circling the Kaaba). Your feet feel it.

Also, room types in Makkah can be tricky. Quad rooms, triple rooms, Haram-view claims, and breakfast rules can change by season.

Time estimate (DIY): 2–6 hours if you want a good deal and a good location.

4) Transfers: airport to Makkah at the wrong time can be rough

Transfers are where DIY gets “real”.

Most UK pilgrims land at King Abdulaziz International Airport (Jeddah). After a long flight, you still need to reach your hotel, check in, and settle. If it’s 1am, that’s not the moment you want to negotiate rides.

Time estimate (DIY): 30–60 minutes of planning. But the real test is on arrival.

5) Makkah to Madinah: train tickets, timings, and baggage rules

This is a big one.

The Haramain High Speed Railway is fast and clean. But you need to choose times that fit hotel check-in and check-out. Also, baggage size rules are strict. And tickets can sell out in peak weeks.

Time estimate (DIY): 30–90 minutes, plus time to get to the station.

6) Your Umrah plan: rituals, timings, and crowd sense

DIY isn’t only “travel”.

You’ll also plan the Umrah steps: Ihram (the white cloth worn during Umrah), Tawaf, Sa’i (walking between Safa and Marwah), and hair cut.

The Real Cost Comparison

Now we get to the part everyone wants.

Below is a realistic 7-night example for 2026. We’re using ranges because prices change by week, and by how early you book. Also, hotel rates in Makkah can jump overnight in busy periods.

So where does the package “extra” go?

If your dates are fixed and you need a close hotel, DIY often ends up similar.

Where DIY Umrah Wins

DIY has real strengths.

And if you're the right type of traveller, it can feel freeing. Here are the situations where we honestly think **diy umrah** can be the better move.

You're flexible with dates (this is the big one)

Flexibility saves money.

If you can fly Tuesday to Tuesday, avoid half-term, and travel outside peak weeks, you can sometimes cut hundreds off flights alone. Packages can't always match that exact window.

You're a repeat pilgrim and you know your way

This matters more than people admit.

You want a very specific hotel (or room type)

Some people want a certain tower.

Others want a kitchenette, interconnecting rooms, or a certain lift bank. DIY can let you hunt for that exact match. Just be careful with “view” claims and room photos.

You're comfortable solving problems in real time

DIY is fine when you're calm.

If a driver cancels, you book another. If a room isn't ready, you wait or switch. If a train time changes, you adjust. Some people are built for that.



Where DIY Goes Wrong – What We See Every Season

This is the hard bit.

Our ops team deals with problems daily in peak weeks. And a lot of those calls start with, “We booked it ourselves, but...”

We’re not sharing this to scare you. We’re sharing it because it’s real.

1) Fake or misleading hotel listings

It still happens.

Sometimes it’s not even “fake”. It’s just misleading. Photos from ten years ago. A map pin that’s wrong. Or a “Haram shuttle” that only runs a few times a day.

One family we helped in 2025 arrived with kids and luggage. The hotel said their booking was “not in the system”. They had a confirmation email. Still, no room. They spent that night moving between lobbies.

In a package, we chase the hotel for you. In DIY, you’re doing it yourself. After a long flight.

2) Non-refundable mistakes add up fast

Small errors cost big money.

Wrong dates by one day. Wrong passenger title. A hotel rate that can’t be changed. A transfer booked to the wrong terminal. It’s not rare.

And here’s the thing. Many DIY deals look cheap because they’re strict. The “flexible” rate is often much higher.

3) Visa issues at the worst time

Visa stress is heavy.

We’ve seen DIY travellers apply late, then panic. We’ve seen applications rejected over simple formatting issues. We’ve seen people unsure what they even applied for.

4) No ground support at 2am

This is the big one.

When you land late at King Abdulaziz Airport, everything feels slower. Bags. queues. SIM setup. Then you still need to reach Makkah.

With a package, you usually have a driver waiting. Or at least a WhatsApp number that answers. With DIY, you're searching while tired.

5) First-timer crowd mistakes

First Umrah is emotional.

But it's also physical. Crowds can be intense near the Kaaba, especially after Maghrib and Isha. First-timers can get separated. Families can get overwhelmed.

Protection - The Bit Nobody Reads

This part matters.

Most people only think about price. But protection is what saves you when things go wrong. And in 2026, travel disruption still happens. Flight changes. Hotel overbookings. Illness. Family emergencies.

DIY protection: you're the organiser

With DIY, you're the travel manager.

That means:

- You deal with each supplier on your own.
- Refund rules can differ for flights, hotels, and transfers.
- If one part cancels, the other parts might not refund.

Sometimes you'll be fine. Sometimes you'll lose money. It depends on what you booked and which rate you chose.

Package protection: look for ATOL where flights are included

ATOL is a UK protection scheme for flight-inclusive holidays.

If your Umrah booking includes flights as part of a package, ask if it's ATOL protected and get proof in writing. You can learn more about ATOL here: [atol.org.uk](https://www.atol.org.uk).

Now, here's our honest note. Not every Umrah booking is ATOL-protected. It depends how it's sold and what's included. So always ask.

Health and vaccine rules (don't ignore this)

This catches people out.

Saudi rules can require certain vaccines for entry in some cases. UK clinics also get busy in peak season. So plan early.

The Hybrid Option

Yes, you can mix both.

Be honest here.
