eSIM Saudi Arabia is the fastest way to get online for your Umrah trip. You can buy it before you fly, switch it on when you land, and skip the airport SIM queues completely. For most UK pilgrims, that's the best option.

You need data straight away. The Nusuk app matters. WhatsApp matters. Google Maps, Careem, hotel check-ins, train tickets, and family updates matter too. So in this guide, we'll show you what to buy, what it costs, and what we recommend to our own pilgrims.

We've found that most people want one simple answer. Here it is. If your phone supports eSIM, buy one before travel. If it doesn't, get a physical Saudi SIM card at the airport. And please don't rely on UK roaming unless you enjoy paying far too much.

Quick answer for UK pilgrims

Let's keep this simple.

For a normal 7 to 14 day Umrah trip, we usually suggest one of these:

- **Best value:** Airalo 5GB for 30 days at about \$14.50, around £11.50
- **Best all-round pick:** Airalo 10GB for 30 days at about \$24, around £19
- **Best unlimited option:** Holafly unlimited for 10 days at about \$27, around £21.50
- **Best airport physical SIM:** STC Visitor 52 for 60 SAR, around £13

That's the short version.

Now, here's the thing. Not every pilgrim needs unlimited data. Most don't. If you mainly use WhatsApp, Nusuk, maps, and a few calls home, 5GB to 10GB is usually enough. A family we helped last month used 5GB each for a 9-day trip, and none of them ran out.

Here's the main choice.

Most pilgrims are deciding between three options. eSIM. Physical SIM. Or roaming on their UK network. They are not equal.

Our view: eSIM wins for most people.




You sort it from home. You avoid kiosk lines. You keep your UK SIM in the phone. And you land with data ready. That last part matters more than people think. At Jeddah, you may need to message your driver, check your hotel, or open a booking email before you've even left the terminal.

Physical SIM is still fine. We do recommend it when a phone doesn't support eSIM, or when someone wants a Saudi number for local calls. Older Android phones often fall into this group.

Roaming is the weak option. It works, yes. But the price is hard to justify. Ten days on EE or Vodafone can cost more than a decent Umrah suitcase.

Best eSIM for Saudi Arabia - Airalo vs Holafly Compared

This is the key bit.

When pilgrims ask us which eSIM to buy, two names come up most. Airalo and Holafly. Saily is also worth a look for light users. But for most Umrah trips, the real choice is value versus unlimited use.

What we recommend to our pilgrims:

- **Budget:** Airalo 5GB
- **Best all-round:** Airalo 10GB
- **No stress:** Holafly unlimited 10 days

To be honest, Airalo is the easiest pick for most people. It gives enough data for WhatsApp, maps, the Nusuk app, hotel lookups, and some video calls. Holafly is better if you know you'll stream, hotspot, or call home a lot.

And yes, prices move. As of 2026, these are the rates we've verified. It's worth checking again before you buy.

Saudi SIM Card at the Airport - STC vs Mobily vs Zain

Physical SIM still has a place.

If your phone doesn't support eSIM, or you want a local Saudi number, airport SIM kiosks are your fallback. The good news is that STC, Mobily and Zain all have decent visitor plans. The bad news? The queues can be long. Very long in peak weeks.

All three usually have kiosks in Jeddah airport arrivals. You show your passport. They register the SIM. Then they set it up for you. It often takes 5 to 10 minutes. Unless there are 40 people in front of you. Which does happen.

We've seen Ramadan arrivals wait 45 minutes just for SIM purchase. Trust us, after a long flight, that feels even longer.

STC tends to be the safest choice for broad coverage across Saudi Arabia. Mobily often gives solid value. Zain can be good if you use a lot of social apps. Inside Masjid al-Haram and around peak prayer times, all networks can slow down a bit. That's normal.

More airport SIM prices

If you want the wider price range, here it is.

- **STC:** 40 SAR to 190 SAR for visitor plans
- **Mobily:** 34.50 SAR to 173 SAR
- **Zain:** 40 SAR to 120 SAR

For most Umrah pilgrims, the sweet spot is around 57 to 75 SAR. That's roughly £12.50 to £16.

Does My Phone Support eSIM? - Quick Check

This part is easy.

Most newer phones do support eSIM. Many older or budget phones do not. As a rough guide, these usually work:

Usually supports eSIM	Usually does not support eSIM
iPhone XS and newer	iPhone X and older
Samsung Galaxy S20 and newer	Samsung Galaxy S10 and older
Google Pixel 3 and newer	Many budget Android phones
Some Huawei P40 models	Older Huawei models

Quick check on iPhone or Android:

1. Open **Settings**
2. Tap **Mobile** or **Cellular**
3. Look for **Add eSIM** or **Add Data Plan**

If you see that option, you're good.

If not, no problem. Just plan to buy a physical SIM after landing. And make sure your phone is unlocked if you want to use a local SIM card. That's a common mistake we see.

How to Activate Your eSIM for Saudi Arabia - Step by Step

It takes two minutes.

Really. That's why so many of our groups now use eSIM instead of waiting at the airport.

Before your flight

1. Buy your eSIM from the provider app or website
2. Choose Saudi Arabia as the destination
3. Select the plan you want
4. Pay with your UK bank card
5. Open the QR code email
6. Go to Settings, then Mobile, then Add eSIM

7. Scan the QR code
8. Name it something simple like Saudi Data

When you land

1. Turn on the eSIM line
2. Set it as your data SIM
3. Turn off roaming on your UK SIM
4. Wait a few seconds for signal

That's it.

Your UK number can still stay active for texts and calls, while the eSIM handles data. That setup works really well for pilgrims who need bank messages, airline alerts, or family calls on their normal UK number.

Look, if you're not very techy, don't worry. We've helped plenty of older pilgrims do this. Once it's scanned, the hard part is done.

UK Roaming in Saudi Arabia - Is It Worth It?

Short answer: no.

The truth is, UK roaming only makes sense as a short emergency fix. Maybe you forgot to sort your data before travel. Fine. Use it for an hour. But not for the whole trip.

A decent eSIM for the same period costs around £11 to £21. Roaming can cost £60 or more. That's money better spent on a better hotel, extra transport, or food in Makkah and Madinah.

Does WhatsApp Work in Saudi Arabia? - Latest Update

Yes. It does.

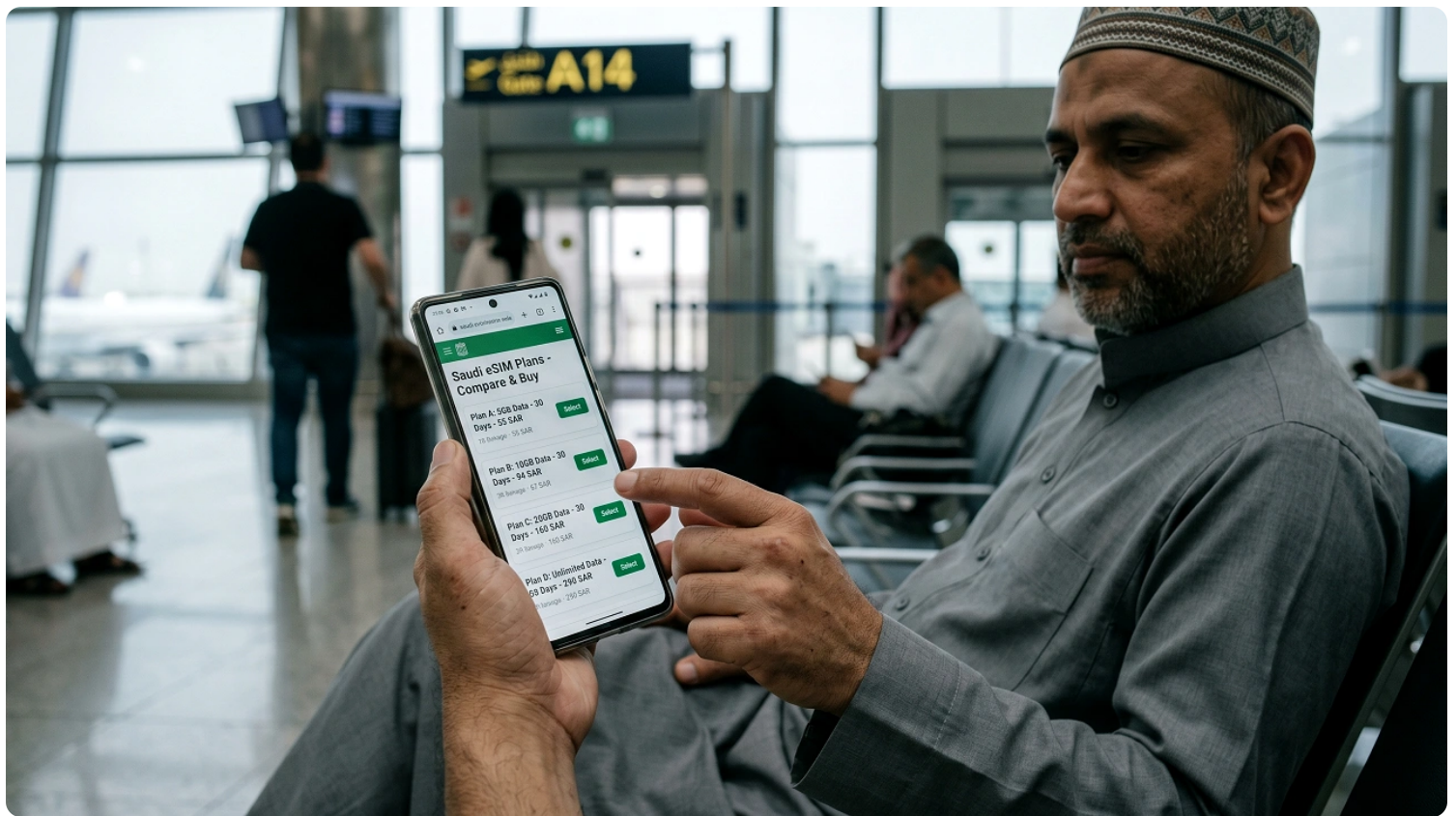
We get asked this a lot. And we understand why. For years, people worried about blocked calls and needing a VPN. But that old advice is out of date now.

- **WhatsApp messaging:** works
- **WhatsApp voice calls:** works
- **WhatsApp video calls:** works
- **FaceTime:** works
- **Zoom:** works
- **Skype:** works

The VoIP restrictions were lifted in 2025. So for normal pilgrims, a VPN is not needed. You can call family back in London, Birmingham or Manchester from your hotel room without any special setup.

That's one more reason an **eSIM Saudi Arabia** setup makes sense. You land, connect, open WhatsApp, and you're done.

Why You Need Mobile Data During Umrah - Essential Apps

You will use it daily.

Some pilgrims think hotel Wi-Fi will be enough. Sometimes it is. Often it isn't. Hotel Wi-Fi can be slow, patchy, or crowded at peak times. Mobile data gives you backup all day.

For most pilgrims, 5GB is enough for a 7 to 10 day trip. If you do daily video calls, upload lots of clips, or share hotspot with family, go for 10GB or unlimited.

Esim Compatible Phone Check Settings for Saudi Travel

What is the best eSIM for Saudi Arabia?

For most pilgrims, Airalo is the best all-round option. It starts cheap, gives flexible data sizes, and works well for normal Umrah use. If you want unlimited data and don't want to think about usage at all, Holafly

is the better fit.

How much does a Saudi SIM card cost?

Airport visitor SIMs usually cost between 34 SAR and 190 SAR. In pounds, that's about £7.50 to £41. Most pilgrims end up spending around £12 to £18 for enough data for a two-week stay.

Can I buy a SIM card at Jeddah airport?

Yes, you can. STC, Mobily and Zain all usually have kiosks in arrivals. Bring your passport and expect a short setup process. In busy periods, expect a queue too.

Does WhatsApp work in Saudi Arabia?

Yes. Messaging, voice calls and video calls all work. That's one of the biggest changes pilgrims notice now. So you can keep in touch with family in the UK without needing extra tools.

Do I need a VPN in Saudi Arabia?

For most people, no. WhatsApp, FaceTime, Zoom and other common apps work fine without it. Unless you have a very specific work reason, you can ignore VPN advice.

Which is better, eSIM or physical SIM for Umrah?

For most UK travellers, eSIM is better. It saves time, avoids airport hassle, and lets you keep your UK SIM active. Physical SIM is still useful if your phone is older or you want a Saudi number.

Does my UK phone work in Saudi Arabia?

Yes, in most cases it will. For eSIM, your phone just needs to support eSIM. For a physical SIM, it should also be network unlocked. That's the bit many people forget to check.

Which Saudi network has the best coverage in Makkah?

STC, Mobily and Zain all work well in Makkah and Madinah. STC has a slight edge for wider coverage across Saudi Arabia. But around the Haram, all networks can slow at prayer peaks because of crowd load.

How much data do I need for a 7 to 10 day Umrah?

5GB is enough for light to normal use. That means WhatsApp, maps, Nusuk and some browsing. If you plan video calls every day, 10GB is safer. If you don't want limits, go unlimited.

Is UK roaming worth it in Saudi Arabia?

Almost never. It's much more expensive than an eSIM or local SIM. We only suggest it as a very short backup if you forgot to set things up before travel.

Our final recommendation

Here's our honest view.

If your phone supports it, buy an **eSIM Saudi Arabia** plan before you fly. For most pilgrims, Airalo 5GB or 10GB is the sweet spot. If you want zero stress about usage, get Holafly unlimited.

If your phone doesn't support eSIM, buy an STC, Mobily or Zain visitor SIM at the airport. It still works well. You just need to allow time for the queue.

So yes, get your internet sorted before travel if you can. It makes the whole trip smoother. Then you can focus on your ibadah, not on hunting for Wi-Fi.
