**Ihram** is more than just a dress code—it's a sacred state you must enter before performing [Umrah](#) or Hajj. For men, it means wearing two white, unstitched sheets. For women, it's modest, loose clothing with the face and hands uncovered. But the real meaning of ihram goes deeper. It's about leaving behind pride and showing equality before Allah (SWT). No matter your background, you stand as a servant, humble and pure. The Quran says: "Hajj is in the well-known months... So whoever undertakes the duty of Hajj, let there be no indecent speech, misbehaviour, or quarrelling during Hajj." ([Quran 2:197](#))

# Preparing for Ihram Before Leaving the UK

---

You don't have to wait until you reach Saudi Arabia to start preparing for ihram. In fact, the best preparation starts at home—especially for UK pilgrims flying from Heathrow, Manchester, or Birmingham.

## Grooming and Ghusl - What to Do Before Ihram

Before putting on your ihram clothes, do a few basic grooming steps. Trim your nails. Remove underarm and pubic hair. Men should trim their moustache. This is Sunnah (the way of the Prophet), not compulsory. Then, perform **ghusl** (a full ritual bath) if you can, using unscented soap. If not possible, **wudu** (ablution) is enough. Many UK pilgrims do this at home before heading to the airport. Why? It's easier and less stressful, especially if you have a long journey ahead.

## Ihram Rules for Men - What to Wear and What to Avoid

---

For men, ihram rules are very specific. The clothing itself is simple, but there are clear restrictions that catch out many first-timers—especially from the UK where stitched clothing is the norm.

## What Men Wear for Ihram - The Izar and Rida

Men must wear two pieces: the **izar** (a lower sheet wrapped around the waist) and the **rida** (an upper sheet draped over the shoulders). Both should be plain white, unstitched, and clean. No patterns. Sandals are allowed, but they must expose the ankle and top of the foot. No shoes, trainers, or socks are permitted while in ihram.

## Ihram Rules That Apply Only to Men

Men face extra restrictions:

- No stitched or tailored clothing at all. That means no underwear, vests, or t-shirts under the sheets.
- No socks, hats, or any head covering—even a cap or a towel over your head isn't allowed.
- No closed shoes—only open sandals.
- Money belts or pouches are fine, as they aren't clothing.

Why these rules? They strip away status, pride, and show humility before Allah. Everyone looks the same—no outward sign of wealth or class.

## Ihram Rules for Women - Clothing, Hijab and What to Avoid

Women's ihram rules are different. You don't have to wear the two white sheets. But there are still important rules to follow.

## What Women Wear for Ihram

Women wear normal, loose, modest Islamic clothing. An abaya (long dress) in any colour is fine. Your clothes must cover your whole body except your face and hands. You must wear a hijab (headscarf). The key point: no need for special white clothing. Just make sure your outfit is loose, clean, and not see-through.

## Ihram Restrictions That Apply Only to Women

- No **niqab** (face veil that touches the face).
- No gloves—your hands must stay uncovered.
- Your face must be uncovered, but you can drape a cloth loosely over it if you're around non-mahram men, as long as it doesn't touch your skin.
- No perfume, no heavy makeup, and avoid scented cosmetics.
- Choose a breathable abaya and a practical hijab—sports hijabs are great for comfort during **Tawaf**.

# How to Enter Ihram - The Step-by-Step Process

---

Ready to start your Umrah or Hajj? Here's how to enter the state of ihram, step by step. This part matters—you can't cross the Miqat (the boundary) without being in ihram.

## The Six Steps to Enter Ihram Correctly

1. **Complete grooming**—trim nails and hair as needed.
2. **Perform ghusl** (full bath) or, if that's not possible, wudu (ablution).
3. **Put on your ihram clothing**—for men, wrap the izar and rida; for women, dress in modest clothes.
4. **Pray two optional rakah** (units of prayer), reading Surah Al-Kafirun and Surah Al-Ikhlâs.
5. **Make your niyyah** (intention) at the Miqat—say: "Labbayka Allahumma Umrah." ([Bukhari 1549](#))
6. **Start reciting the Talbiyah**. Men say it loudly, women softly. ([Muslim 1184](#))

Once you've made your niyyah and said the Talbiyah, you're now in ihram. From this point, all ihram rules apply.

## Understanding the Miqat - When UK Pilgrims Must Enter Ihram

The **Miqat** is the boundary you cannot cross without being in ihram. UK pilgrims flying direct to Jeddah will hear a Miqat announcement on the plane—usually 30-40 minutes before landing. Most put on ihram at Heathrow, Manchester, or Birmingham airports. The Miqat for UK flights is called Al-Juhfah. Don't wait until you're in the air if you're worried about time—many of our clients dress at the airport, with their niyyah delayed until the pilot's announcement. ## Everything That Is Forbidden During Ihram

---

Here's the heart of the matter: what's **forbidden** in ihram? These rules apply to both Hajj and Umrah. Break them, and you may need to pay a penalty (fidyah). Let's make this simple.

## Ihram Rules That Apply to Everyone - Universal Prohibitions

1. No perfume, scented soap, cologne, or any fragrance on your body or clothes.

2. No cutting or trimming hair anywhere on your body.
3. No cutting or trimming nails.
4. No sexual relations, kissing, or intimate contact.
5. No marriage proposals, contracts, or wedding arrangements.
6. No hunting, killing, or helping to hunt land animals.
7. No uprooting or damaging plants within the Haram boundary.
8. No arguing, fighting, or using foul language. (Quran 2:197)

## Additional Ihram Rules for Men and Women Separately

- **Men:** No stitched clothing, underwear, socks, or head covering. No closed shoes.
- **Women:** No niqab, no gloves, face and hands must be uncovered.

## What Happens If You Break an Ihram Rule - Fidyah Explained

So, what if you slip up and break one of the ihram rules? Don't panic. Islam offers a way to make up for most mistakes: it's called **fidyah** (compensation).

### Ihram Rules and Penalties - The Three Fidyah Options

If you break an ihram rule (except for sexual relations, which has a separate ruling), you must do **one** of the following:

- **Fast for three days**
- **Feed six poor people** (about 1.5kg staple food per person)

- **Sacrifice a sheep or goat**

This is from the Quran: "...or an expiation: either fasting, or charity, or sacrifice..." (Quran 2:196). Hadith: The Prophet (SAW) told Ka'b ibn Ujrah to perform fidyah after violating an ihram rule (Bukhari 1840).

## Accidental Mistakes vs Deliberate Violations

If you make a mistake by accident, there's no sin—**but** fidyah is still required according to most scholars. If you break a rule on purpose, it's a sin and fidyah is definitely due. Some real examples from our UK clients:

- Used scented soap by mistake? Wash it off, pay fidyah.
- Hair fell out while gently combing? If not deliberate, no fidyah.
- Accidentally sprayed perfumed deodorant? Wash area, pay fidyah.

Always check with your group imam if you're unsure—every situation is different. And remember, it's better to ask than to panic. Noor Umrah Travels guides are always here to help.

## Personal Hygiene and Daily Life During Ihram - What Is Actually Allowed

---

Many UK pilgrims ask: what is allowed in ihram? Here are the biggest questions, answered clearly.

### Hygiene in Ihram - Showering, Teeth and Grooming

**Can you shower in ihram?** Yes, you can shower or wash. Just use unscented soap and be gentle with your hair. The Prophet (SAW) poured water over his head while in ihram (Bukhari 1840).

**Can you brush your teeth in ihram?** Yes. Use a miswak or plain toothpaste. Avoid anything strongly scented.

**Can you cut or pluck hair?** No. Trimming, shaving, or plucking are all forbidden. The same goes for nails—don't cut them until you exit ihram.

## Clothing Questions in Ihram - Socks, Underwear and Changing Clothes

**Can men wear socks or underwear in ihram?** No. For men, both are forbidden. Women can wear both.

**Can you change your ihram clothes?** Yes. If your clothes get dirty, you can change into a clean set, as long as it follows ihram rules.

## Everyday Activities in Ihram - Phone, Sleep, Food and Sunscreen

**Can you use your phone in ihram?** Yes. There's no rule against devices. But try to keep your focus on worship.

**Can you sleep in ihram?** Yes. Sleeping doesn't affect the state of ihram.

**Can you eat and drink in ihram?** Yes. Eat halal food as usual. Stay hydrated—it's hot in Makkah.

**Can you use deodorant or sunscreen?** Only if it's completely unscented. Always check labels carefully before your trip.

**Can women wear coloured clothing in ihram?** Yes. Any modest colour is fine—white is not required.

## Common Ihram Rules Mistakes UK Pilgrims Should Avoid

1. Crossing the Miqat boundary without entering ihram.
2. Men wearing underwear or socks under their sheets.
3. Using scented toiletries out of habit.

5. Not knowing the fidyah rules and panicking after a mistake.
6. Applying perfume before putting on ihram and then wearing it.
7. Men covering their head with a towel or blanket while sleeping.
8. Women thinking they must wear white only—any colour is fine.
9. Forgetting to start reciting the Talbiyah after making niyyah.
10. Delaying ihram and missing the Miqat announcement on the plane.

## When Does the State of Ihram End?

For Umrah, your state of ihram ends after you complete Tawaf (circumambulation of the Kaaba), Sa'i (walking between Safa and Marwah), and Halq or Taqsir (shaving or trimming hair). For Hajj, ihram continues through additional rites in Mina, Arafat, and Muzdalifah. Once you finish these, all ihram restrictions are lifted. ## Practical Ihram Tips for UK Pilgrims

- Put on your ihram at home after ghusl. Then travel to Heathrow, Manchester, or Birmingham in your ihram—it saves time and stress.
- Pack a spare ihram set in your carry-on. If one set gets dirty, you're covered.
- Practise wrapping the izar and rida at home before you fly. This avoids embarrassing moments in the airport!
- Use a money belt or ihram belt to keep your lower sheet secure. It's not considered stitched clothing.
- Buy and pack only unscented toiletries. Check everything before you leave the UK.

- Listen carefully for the Miqat announcement on your flight. Make your niyyah as soon as you hear it.

## FAQ - Frequently Asked Questions About Ihram

We get these questions from UK pilgrims every Umrah and Hajj season. Here are the answers you need, fast.

### Is ghusl before ihram compulsory or just Sunnah?

Ghusl before ihram is Sunnah Mu'akkadah (strongly recommended), not compulsory. If you can't do ghusl due to illness or travel, wudu is enough. The Prophet (peace be upon him) performed ghusl before entering ihram at the Miqat. Many UK pilgrims do ghusl at home before heading to the airport.

## **Can a woman in her period enter the state of ihram?**

Yes. A menstruating woman CAN enter ihram, make her intention, and recite the Talbiyah. She does all rites except Tawaf, which she delays until purified. This is based on the hadith where the Prophet (SAW) told Aisha (RA) to do everything except Tawaf during her menses. (Bukhari 1650)

## **Do children have to follow ihram rules?**

Children under the age of responsibility aren't held to ihram rules like adults. But parents are encouraged to dress them in ihram and teach the basics. If a child breaks a rule, there is no fidyah required. Many UK families use Umrah as a learning opportunity for their young ones.

## **Can you wear a money belt or pouch under your ihram?**

Yes. Money belts, pouches, or shoulder bags are permitted for men and women. They're not considered stitched clothing in the prohibited sense. Most UK pilgrims carry their passport, phone, and cash this way. We strongly recommend it for security.

## **Can you look in a mirror while in ihram?**

Yes. Looking in a mirror is allowed. The rule is against beautification or grooming, not checking your appearance. You can use a mirror to make sure your ihram is wrapped properly or for any practical reason.

## **Do ihram rules apply the same for Hajj and Umrah?**

Yes, the rules are identical for both. The only difference is duration: for Umrah, ihram ends after Tawaf, Sa'i, and shaving or trimming. For Hajj, ihram lasts through additional rites at Mina, Arafat, and Muzdalifah.

## **What should you do if you miss the Miqat without entering ihram?**

If you pass the Miqat by mistake, you should return to it and enter ihram from there. If that's impossible, enter ihram immediately and pay fidyah (sacrifice a sheep) as most scholars advise. Many UK pilgrims miss the announcement—don't be shy to ask your group leader for help.

## Are elderly or disabled pilgrims exempt from any ihram rules?

Ihram prohibitions apply to all, regardless of age or ability. However, if an elderly or disabled pilgrim faces genuine hardship, they can use a wheelchair, get assistance, or use necessary medical items (even if scented)—then pay fidyah if needed. Always check with your group’s scholar for your specific case.
