The Mahram Rule Has Changed - What It Means for UK Women (2026)

The rule change is real.

For years, many women believed they *must* have a mahram (a male guardian you can't marry, like your father, brother, husband, or son) to do Umrah. That's why you still see the question everywhere: **can a woman go to umrah without mahram?**

Saudi Arabia's travel rules shifted from around 2021 onwards, and the practical result is this: many adult women can now enter Saudi for Umrah without a mahram, depending on the visa route and current policy. In 2026, we're still seeing women travel without a mahram on valid visas, with confirmed hotels and return flights.

But. Fiqh (Islamic rulings) and state rules aren't the same thing. Some scholars allow it with safe travel and a trusted group. Others still advise a mahram if possible. So please do speak to your local scholar if you're unsure. That matters.

From a UK booking point of view, here's what changes in real life:

- **Visa and entry checks** are about your documents, not who you're related to.
- **Airline staff** may ask questions if they're not up to date. It happens.
- **Hotel check-in** is usually smooth if your booking is clear and your ID matches.
- **Ground travel** (Jeddah to Makkah, Makkah to Madinah) is easier in a group or with pre-booked drivers.

We've seen the biggest stress at the *UK departure desk*, not in Saudi. So we always advise women travelling without a mahram to carry:

- Printed hotel confirmations (Makkah and Madinah).
- Return flight details.
- Travel insurance certificate.
- A simple letter with your UK address and emergency contact.

Also, keep your plans simple. Don't book odd split stays across many hotels. It can raise questions. A clean plan is calmer.

Ihram for Women – What to Actually Wear

Keep it modest and simple.

Ihram for women is often misunderstood because men have a very clear two-cloth garment. Women don't have a fixed "uniform" like that. Instead, women enter ihram (the sacred state for Umrah) wearing modest clothing that meets Islamic guidelines, and they follow the ihram rules.

Let's make it easy. For most sisters from the UK, the best approach is:

- A plain, loose abaya or jilbab (dark colours are common, but not required).
- A comfortable hijab that stays put.
- Layers for air con and night walks.
- Footwear you can walk in for long distances.

And yes, you can wear stitched clothing. That “no stitching” rule is for men’s ihram garments, not women’s everyday modest clothes.

Is there a set colour for women’s ihram?

No. There’s no single required colour.

White is fine. Black is fine. Beige is fine. Just keep it modest, not see-through, and not attention-grabbing.

Can women cover their face in ihram? (Niqab and mask)

This gets asked daily.

In ihram, women should not wear a stitched niqab or face veil that sits on the face, and they should not wear gloves. That’s the common ruling taught in most Umrah groups. But women can still cover their face *without* wearing a fitted niqab, such as by lowering a loose scarf if needed for modesty.

Also, many sisters wear a medical mask for comfort. In crowded areas, it can help. If you’re concerned, ask a scholar you trust before you fly. It’ll settle your heart.

Footwear: what works in the Haram

Comfort beats style.

You’ll walk a lot. Tawaf (circling the Kaaba) can be 2–4 km depending on the level. Sa’i (walking between Safa and Marwah) is about 3.5 km. And that’s before you count the walk from hotel lifts to the mosque gates.

- Choose flat sandals with a secure strap.
- Avoid slippery soles. Marble can be slick.
- Bring blister plasters. Just do it.

Umrah for Women Step by Step (Women-Specific Notes)

Most steps are the same.

1) Intention and entering ihram at the right point

Start calm. Don't rush.

Most UK flights land in Jeddah. Some land in Madinah first. Your miqat (the point before which you must enter ihram) depends on your route. Many sisters change into ihram-friendly clothes before the flight, then make intention when the captain announces the miqat.

And yes, you can make intention quietly. That's fine.

Talbiyah (when entering Ihram)

Women recite the talbiyah softly. That's the common practice taught in groups. Men raise their voice more. So don't feel shy about being quiet.

2) Entering Masjid al-Haram

The first sight can shake you.

Even sisters who've been before tell us the same thing. Your heart goes soft. Your eyes fill. So take a breath. Walk slowly. Stay close to your group.

3) Tawaf: what's different for women

Women do Tawaf like everyone else.

But there are two common differences:

- No **raml** (the brisk walk/jog) for women. That's for men in the first three rounds.
- No **idtiba** (uncovering the right shoulder). That's men's clothing style.

Also, be smart about timing. If you're in a sisters group, we often aim for late night or after Fajr when it's calmer. In peak seasons, even the outer rings can be packed.

And please don't fight to kiss the Black Stone. It's not worth harm. A wave from a distance is fine when crowded.

Dua Between Yemeni Corner and Black Stone

4) Two rak'ahs after Tawaf (near Maqam Ibrahim)

Pray where you can.

If it's crowded near Maqam Ibrahim, step back. Pray in any safe spot in the mosque. It counts.

Ayah at Maqam Ibrahim (After Tawaf)

يَا أَيُّهَا الَّذِينَ آمَنُوا خُذُوا مِنْ مَقَامِي إِبْرَاهِيمَ وَمِنْ هَذَا حُجَّتْ أَوْ

Wattakhidhu min maqami Ibrahima musalla

TRANSLATION

And take the Station of Ibrahim as a place of prayer.

5) Sa'i (Safa and Marwah)

Sa'i is straightforward.

Women walk the full path. The green lights mark the brisk-walk zone for men. Women can keep a normal pace. No need to run.

Dua for Sa'i at Safa

Innas-Safa wal-Marwata min sha'a'irillah

6) Hair cutting (taqsir) for women

Yes, women cut hair too.

After Sa'i, women trim a small amount from the ends of their hair. Many scholars mention about a fingertip length. It's a trim, not a shave.

We suggest you do it privately in your hotel room. Bring small scissors. Keep them in checked luggage when flying.



Managing Your Period Around Umrah (Without Panic)

This is the big worry.

And to be honest, it's also the part most blogs don't handle well. Periods are normal. But they can affect Tawaf. So you need a plan, and you need calm guidance.

First, a gentle reminder: rulings can differ by madhhab (school of thought) and by scholar. So if you have a complex case, ask a scholar you trust. That's best.

Can you do Tawaf on your period?

Most scholars say no.

In the most common teaching, Tawaf needs purity like salah (prayer). So if your period starts before Tawaf, you wait until it ends. Then you do ghusl and complete Tawaf and Sa'i.

But if your period starts *after* Tawaf, and you've already done Sa'i, you're usually fine. Your Umrah is complete once you've done Tawaf, Sa'i, and hair trimming.

What can you still do in Makkah while menstruating?

A lot, actually.

- Make dhikr and du'a.
- Give charity.
- Listen to Qur'an recitation.
- Do ziyarat (visits) around Makkah.
- Rest. Sleep is worship too when you're drained.

You can still be near the Haram area, but you won't enter the prayer spaces for Tawaf. Staff may guide you if you're unsure.

Should you delay your period with tablets?

Some sisters do.

But we never tell anyone to self-medicate. Please speak to your GP or a qualified clinician first, especially if you have migraines, clot risk, or irregular cycles. In the UK, you can also read general health guidance via the NHS: [nhs.uk](https://www.nhs.uk).

From our group experience, the best "period strategy" is often just smart dates:

- Book travel for the week after your period usually ends.
- Avoid very tight 5-7 day trips if your cycle is due.
- If you're doing a short stay, keep a buffer day.

And if you're thinking, "My cycle is never predictable", you're not alone. Many sisters tell us that. So we plan with extra time.

A real scenario we've seen (Bradford mum and daughter)

A sister from Bradford travelled with her adult daughter in a small group we arranged. She was worried her period would start on day two. So we booked a plan that put Makkah first, with enough days to wait if needed. She completed Tawaf the first night, did Sa'i early morning, and then relaxed for the rest of the stay. Her period began later in the trip, and it didn't affect her Umrah at all.

That's the goal. Less stress. More worship.

Praying in Masjid al-Haram and Masjid Nabawi as a Woman

It's easier when you know where to go.

Both mosques have women's areas. But the entrances and flow can change by time of day, crowd level, and staff direction. So don't feel bad if you get turned around once. It happens (trust us, we've seen it happen).

Women's prayer area in Masjid al-Haram (Makkah)

The women's sections are usually on specific levels and zones.

In busy seasons, you may be guided to upper floors. In quieter times, you might pray closer. It depends. Our best advice is simple:

- Go early for each salah, especially Maghrib and Isha.
- Use a landmark: a gate number, a hotel tower view, or a known escalator.
- If you're with family, agree a meeting point outside after prayer.

Women's entrance and prayer areas in Masjid Nabawi (Madinah)

Madinah feels different.

It's calmer. It's softer. And many sisters tell us they feel safe walking to prayer, even at night, because the whole area is built around the mosque.

Women's entrances are managed with clear staff presence. But the exact gate used can change. So follow signage and staff direction on the day.

Rawdah for women: how booking works in 2026

Rawdah is limited.

Rawdah (Ar-Rawdah Ash-Shareefah) is the blessed area in Masjid Nabawi. It's precious. And it's controlled by permits.

In 2026, most women book a slot through the Nusuk app. Slots can appear and disappear fast. So here's what we tell our groups:

1. Install and set up Nusuk before you fly.
2. Use the same passport details you'll travel with.
3. Check for slots at odd times (late night UK time can help).
4. Be ready to take any reasonable time, not just "perfect" times.

Travelling as a Solo Woman or Women-Only Group from the UK

You have options.

We're seeing three common styles of **umrah for women** travel from the UK in 2026:

- **Solo travel** (often confident sisters with travel experience).
- **Two-person travel** (mum and daughter, sisters, friends).
- **Women-only Umrah groups** (a set group with a lead and shared support).

What women-only Umrah groups from the UK are really like

They're not "touristy".

Most sisters join because they want safety, ease, and someone to ask questions. Our women-only departures usually include:

- Group airport meet-up and check-in support.
- Pre-booked transfers (so you're not negotiating taxis at 2am).
- Hotel locations chosen for walkability and safe access.
- A clear daily plan, but with free time built in.

And yes, we keep it spiritually focused. That's the point.

Is Saudi Arabia safe for women travelling alone?

In many areas, yes.

Makkah and Madinah are built around pilgrims. There's security, lighting, and constant footfall. Still, "safe" doesn't mean "careless". Use normal travel sense:

- Keep your phone charged and carry a power bank.
- Don't walk isolated back streets at night.
- Use hotel taxis or trusted ride options when possible.
- Share live location with family.

Also, stay close to the Haram zone. Long commutes add stress.

Night arrivals are common.

Safety, Culture and Practical Tips

Small choices make a big difference.

We'll keep this section very practical. These are the tips sisters tell us they wish they knew earlier.

1) Dress outside ihram: stay modest, but stay comfortable

Abayas are normal in both cities.

You'll see every style. Still, we suggest you keep it plain and breathable. In summer months, heat is intense. In winter, nights can be cool. So layers help.

Also, avoid strong perfume in the Haram area, especially while in ihram. Unscented products are safer.

2) Keep your essentials in one small bag

Don't carry a big handbag.

Use a small crossbody bag for:

- Passport copy and hotel card.
- Some cash (SAR) and a bank card.
- Tissues and unscented wipes.
- Mini prayer mat (thin).

3) Toilets and wudu: plan ahead

Queues can be long.

So go early. And keep a small pack of tissues. It sounds basic. But it saves you.

4) Keep your phone connected (Nusuk, maps, family contact)

Data matters in Umrah.

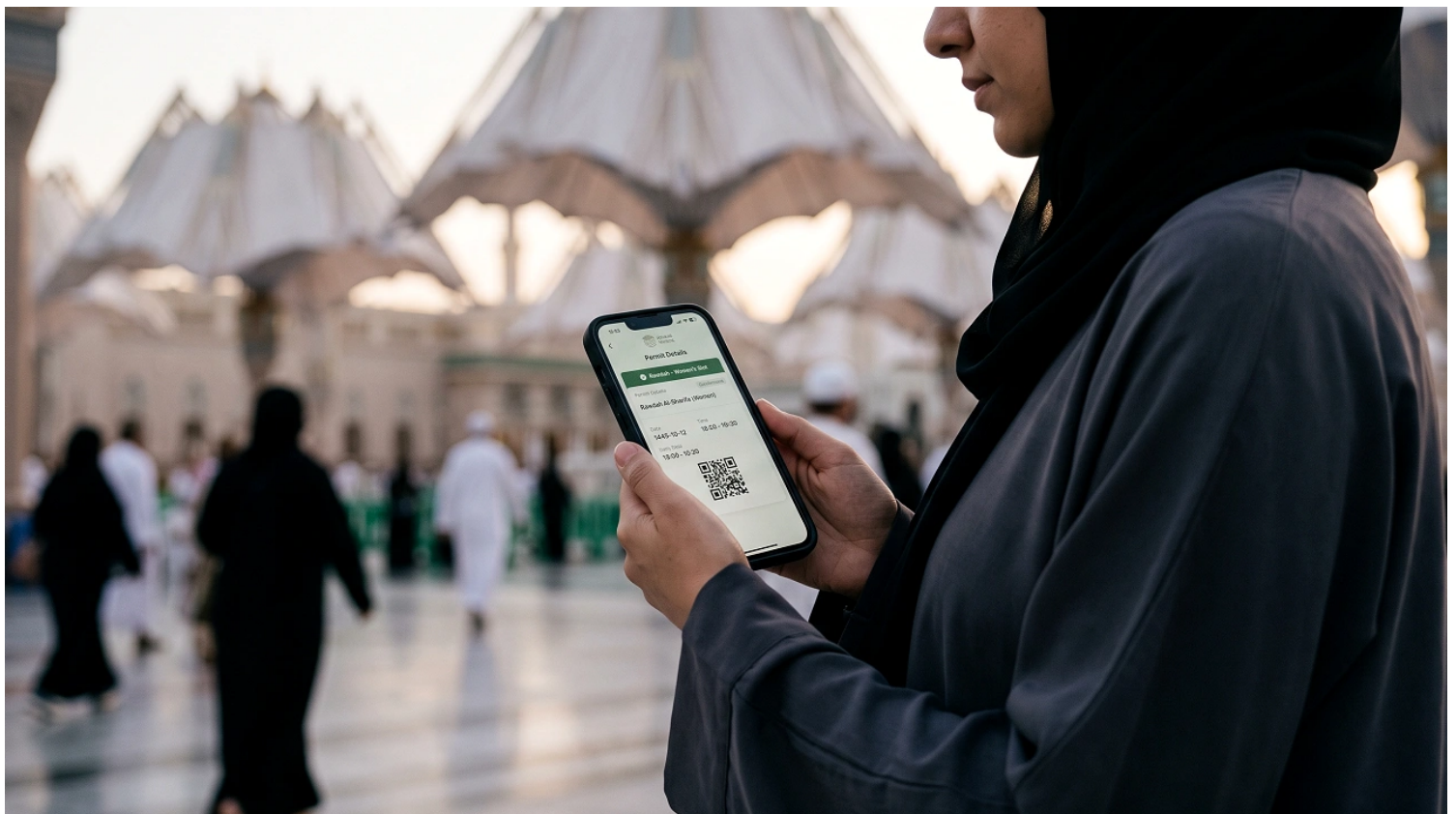

Packing Essentials for Women

Pack light. Pack smart.

Most sisters overpack on their first trip. Then they regret it after one week of lifts, corridors, and suitcase zips at 2am.

Clothing

- 2-3 abayas/jilbabs (lightweight, breathable).
- 3-5 undercaps (they get sweaty).
- Comfortable hijabs that don't slip.
- Light cardigan for air con.

Footwear

- 1 main walking sandal.
- 1 spare pair (blisters happen).
- Thin socks for hotel and cooler nights.

Health and personal items

- Unscented soap, shampoo, wipes (for ihram).
- Period products you trust (brands can differ in Saudi).
- Electrolyte sachets (heat drains you fast).
- Plasters and blister pads.

Spiritual essentials

- Small Qur'an or Qur'an app (offline download helps).
- Du'a notes on your phone.
- Charity money set aside.

FAQ: Umrah for Women (2026)

These are the questions we get asked most.



Can a woman perform Umrah without a mahram in 2026?

In many cases, yes, based on current Saudi travel rules. That said, Islamic rulings can differ, so it's wise to ask a scholar you trust. From a UK travel view, women travelling without a mahram should keep documents clear and bookings simple. It also helps to travel with a trusted friend or a women-only group.

What do women wear for Umrah ihram?

Women wear normal modest clothes that meet hijab guidelines, like a loose abaya and hijab. There's no fixed colour and no special two-cloth garment like men. Avoid perfume while in ihram, and choose breathable fabrics. Comfort matters because you'll walk a lot.

Can women wear the niqab or gloves in ihram?

Most scholars say women should not wear a fitted niqab or gloves while in ihram. If modesty is a concern, many sisters use a loose scarf that doesn't sit like a stitched face veil. In crowded areas, some women wear a mask for comfort. If you're unsure, ask before you travel so you're not stressed in Makkah.

What happens if my period starts during Umrah?

If your period starts before Tawaf, most scholars say you should pause and wait until it ends, then do ghusl and complete Tawaf and Sa'i. If it starts after you've finished Tawaf and Sa'i, your Umrah is usually already complete. You can still make du'a, dhikr, and do many other acts of worship. For personal cases, check with a scholar.

Can women do tawaf on their period?

Most common rulings say no, because Tawaf requires purity like prayer. This is why planning dates is so helpful for **umrah for women**. If you're worried about timing, book a longer stay so you have a buffer. And speak to your GP before taking any delay tablets.

Where is the women's prayer area in Masjid al-Haram?

Women's prayer areas are arranged in specific zones and levels, and staff may guide you based on crowd flow. The best tip is to arrive early and use a clear meeting point if you're with family. In peak times, you may be directed to upper floors. Don't worry if it feels confusing on day one.

How do women book the Rawdah in Madinah?

Most women book Rawdah slots through the Nusuk app in 2026. Slots can be limited, so set up the app before you fly and keep checking. Be flexible on timing, because "perfect" slots go fast. Our step-by-step Nusuk help is here: [Nusuk App Guide – How to Register for Umrah from UK](#).
