Should You Take the Kids?

Let's be honest. It's not easy.

But it can be one of the best things you do as a family. We've had parents tell us the same line again and again: "It was hard... and it was worth it."

Before you book, ask one simple question: **what do you want from this trip?** If your goal is long nights of worship, a toddler might not match that pace. If your goal is to take your children to the House of Allah, build love for the Haram, and make memories, it can be perfect.

Now, here's the thing. Most stress in umrah with kids comes from three avoidable problems:

- **Hotel too far** from Masjid al-Haram or Masjid Nabawi.
- **Bad flight timing** with overtired children.
- **No plan** for Tawaf (circling the Kaaba) and Sa'i (walking between Safa and Marwah).

We'll cover all of that. Step by step.

The real pros (what parents tell us afterwards)

These are the wins families mention most.

- **Your kids remember the Haram.** Even little ones remember the lights, the adhan, the calm.
- **It softens the whole home.** Parents often say the weeks after are different.
- **You slow down.** That can be a gift. You notice more.

And yes, you'll still get worship done. It just looks different. It's shorter. It's more focused. And it's often more sincere.

The real cons (so you can plan around them)

These come up a lot. So plan for them.

- **Sleep gets messy.** Jet lag in Saudi Arabia hits children hard.
- **Heat and crowds** can drain everyone fast.
- **Meals can be a battle.** Buffets aren't always "kid friendly".
- **Tantrums happen.** Even in the Haram. It's okay.

Umrah with Kids by Age Group

Age changes everything.

So we'll break umrah with kids into four groups. Use the one that matches your child. Then read the next one too. Kids change fast.

Umrah with a baby (under 2)

This is the "carry and cope" stage.

Babies don't need to "understand" Umrah for it to be meaningful. You're still taking them to blessed places. And you're still making dua as a parent. That matters.

What's realistic with a baby:

- Short Tawaf at quiet times.
- Sa'i in the air-conditioned gallery.
- Lots of breaks back at the hotel.

What's hard:

- Nappy changes in busy toilets.
- Feeding schedules in crowds.
- Heat when you're outside the main halls.

One tip we share a lot: book a hotel that's genuinely close. Not "10 minutes by bus". With a baby, that becomes 40 minutes. If you're picking stays, our hotel guides help you judge distance properly: [Best Hotels Near Haram Makkah – Complete Guide for Umrah Pilgrims](#) and [Best Hotels Near Masjid Nabawi Madinah – Complete Guide for Umrah Pilgrims](#).

Also, bring a baby carrier. A pram is great. But there will be moments you can't use it.

Umrah with toddler (age 2-5)

This is the toughest stage for many parents.

If you've been asking, "**is umrah hard with kids?**" it's usually toddlers people mean. They can walk. But they can't walk for long. They want independence. But they need constant watch.

What works with toddlers:

- Do Umrah rites in "shifts" between parents.
- Use a lightweight stroller with a deep recline.
- Pick one main goal per day. That's it.

A common mistake: parents try to match adult pace. It backfires. Your toddler melts down. Then everyone's upset. Keep it gentle.

We helped a Manchester family of five last season. Mum, dad, a 3-year-old, a 7-year-old, and a teen. They booked a hotel that was "only" a 12-minute walk. On day one, that walk took nearly an hour with

stops. By day two, they paid for taxis just to survive. They told us later, “We wish we’d listened and stayed closer.” So yes, we say it clearly: **with a toddler, stay within about 5 minutes of the Haram if you can.**

If you’re weighing trip length, this matters too. A short trip can be easier with toddlers. Here’s our timing breakdown: [How Long Does Umrah Take? Complete Duration Guide.](#)



Umrah with kids (age 5-10)

This is the sweet spot.

Kids in this age group can do a lot. They can follow simple rules. They can hold your hand. They can even help you remember your bag.

What works well:

- Explain each rite in one line. Keep it simple.
- Give them a “Haram job”. Like holding the Zamzam cups.
- Build in a treat. Like a date milkshake after Maghrib.

What to watch: tiredness. Kids can look fine, then crash fast. So plan naps. A hotel close to the mosque makes naps possible.

Umrah with older kids and teens (11+)

Teens can surprise you.

Some become deeply spiritual on this trip. Others get bored fast. So involve them. Give them ownership.

What helps with teens:

- Let them choose a dua list to memorise.
- Give them time alone (safely) in the hotel lobby or prayer area.
- Talk about adab (manners) in crowds before you arrive.

Do Children Need Ihram and a Visa?

This bit causes stress.

So we'll keep it plain and clear. There are two parts: fiqh (religious rules) and travel rules (Saudi entry rules).

Do children need to wear ihram?

It depends on age and ability.

In simple terms: if a child is doing Umrah, they enter ihram (the sacred state). For boys, that often means the two white cloths. For girls, it's normal modest clothes. No special "ihram dress" is needed.

But young children aren't sinful if they make mistakes. They're learning. So don't panic.

Kids' ihram rules parents ask us most:

- **Little boys:** can wear the two cloths, but use clips or a belt. It slips.
- **Girls:** wear loose modest clothing. No face covering during ihram.
- **Very young children:** you can guide them and intend on their behalf.

Do kids need an Umrah visa?

Yes, children need valid entry permission.

For UK families in 2026, the most common routes are:

- Saudi eVisa (when eligible and open for your travel dates)
- Umrah visa via an approved travel agent package
- Saudi visa waiver options (for short stays, when applicable)

Rules can change. So always check close to booking. We keep our visa posts updated for UK travellers.

Passport rule reminder: every child needs their own passport. And it must be valid for the required period. Don't leave this late.

Vaccines for children (UK angle)

This matters for entry and safety.

Flights from the UK with Children

Flights can make or break the start.

We see this all the time. If the flight goes well, parents arrive calm. If it goes badly, day one is a write-off.

Direct vs indirect flights (what we see with families)

Direct is easier. Most of the time.

But indirect can be cheaper. It can also be risky with kids. Missed connections happen. And tired kids don't "wait nicely".

Our rule of thumb:

- If you're travelling with a baby or toddler, try for the simplest route.
- If you have older kids and you're saving a lot, one stop can work.

Night flights: good idea or disaster?

It depends on your child.

Some kids sleep through. Others don't sleep at all. If your child struggles with sleep changes, a daytime flight can be kinder.

One thing that helps: keep pyjamas and toothbrush in your cabin bag. Change them on the plane. It signals "sleep time". It sounds small. It works.

Halal kids' meals and picky eating

Book the child meal early.

Also pack backup snacks. Airline meals get delayed. Or your child refuses it. So bring safe foods from the UK like:

- oat bars
- rice cakes
- mini cereal boxes
- dates

And bring an empty water bottle. Fill it after security.

Arrival in Saudi: what to expect at the airport

Most UK families land in Jeddah.

Jeddah airport can feel intense after a long flight. There are often family lanes, but they're not always clearly marked. So keep your documents ready. Keep your children close. And keep your cool.

Hotels That Work for Families

Your hotel choice matters more than you think.

With umrah with kids, the "perfect" hotel is not always the fanciest. It's the one that lets you rest, reset, and get back to the Haram fast.

What UK parents should look for

Keep it practical.

- **Distance:** a true short walk beats a shuttle bus with a stroller.
- **Room type:** family room, quad room, or connecting rooms.
- **Lifts:** more lifts = less queue time with tired kids.
- **Breakfast style:** buffet is handy, but it’s busy.
- **Noise:** some rooms face the road. Light sleepers struggle.

Three family-friendly hotel set-ups (comparison table)

Here’s a simple way to think about it.

One quad room (4 beds or 2 beds + sofa)	Families with 2–3 young kids	Everyone together, easier bedtime, one bathroom routine	Less privacy, can feel tight with pushchair and luggage	Ask for extra luggage rack space and a quiet floor
Connecting rooms (two rooms with internal door)	Families with older kids or teens	Space, two bathrooms, parents can rest	Not always available, sometimes costs more	Request connecting rooms at booking, not at check-in
Two separate rooms (same floor if possible)	Large families (5–7 people)	Often easier to find than connecting rooms	Harder with toddlers, you’ll walk back and forth	Try to keep rooms on the same corridor

Makkah vs Madinah hotel reality

Makkah is tougher with kids.

It’s busier. It’s more crowded. The walks can be steeper. So we often suggest spending a bit more in Makkah for closeness, then balancing it in Madinah.

A quick note on “buffet reality” with children

Buffets look great online. Then you arrive.

At peak times, it’s loud and packed. Plates are hot. Kids run. So go early. Or go late. And keep one adult at the table while the other serves.

If you want a simpler trip, choose a package where breakfast is included and close to your room. Our shorter stays can help with this. For example, many families like a 10-day plan: [10 Days 4 Star Umrah Package](#).

Strollers, Wheelchairs and the Haram

Yes, you can bring a pram.

But there are rules and practical limits. And they change with crowd levels.

Can you take a stroller in Masjid al-Haram?

Often, yes. But not everywhere.

In our experience, strollers are easiest in:

- the outer courtyards
- some access routes around the mosque
- less busy prayer times

But during peak crowd times, staff may direct you away from tight areas. So keep a baby carrier ready. It saves you.

Stroller tip: bring a light one. Big travel systems are a nightmare in lifts and crowds.

Wheelchair rental and pushing during Tawaf

Wheelchairs are common in Makkah.

Some families use them for grandparents. Some use them for a parent who's recovering after birth. You can often find rental options near the mosque area. But availability changes by season.

If you'll need one, tell us early. When we build [Umrah packages](#) for families, we plan hotel access and walking distance around that need.

Upper levels for Tawaf (very useful with kids)

This is a big one.

If the ground floor is too packed, the upper levels can feel safer with children. It's more space. It's less pushing. It can take longer, though. So plan your child's energy.

Also, keep a clear meeting point. Even in a family group. "If we get split, we meet at X." Say it out loud.

Doing Tawaf and Sa'i with Little Ones

This is the heart of it.

And it's where parents worry most. So let's make it simple and real.

Tawaf with a pushchair: what works

Choose the right time.

For many families, the easiest windows are:

- late morning on weekdays
- after Isha when some crowds thin
- outside peak seasons

But timings change. Ramadan and school holidays are different. If you're thinking of a summer trip, you can check options like [July Umrah Packages](#).

Parent shift method (we recommend it):

1. One parent focuses on the rite and dua.
2. The other parent focuses on the child and the path.
3. Swap roles each round or halfway.

It sounds obvious. But it stops arguments. And it keeps everyone calmer.

Sa’i is easier than most parents expect

Sa’i is between Safa and Marwah.

It’s indoors and air-conditioned in many parts. That helps kids a lot. You can also pause. You can sit. You can hydrate.

On your first time at Safa, you can recite the Quran verse that begins the rite. Here it is in Arabic, with a simple meaning.

Verse at the start of Sa’i (Safa and Marwah)	
ARABIC	إِنَّ سَاعَةَ الْوَرَمِ لَأَوْفُصِّلَانِ
TRANSLITERATION	<i>Innas-Safa wal-Marwata min sha'a'irillah</i>
TRANSLATION	Indeed, Safa and Marwah are among the symbols of Allah.
REFERENCE	Quran (Al-Baqarah 2:158)

Keep your child close. That’s the main rule.

Do kids have to complete Tawaf and Sa’i?

If a child is doing Umrah, they do the rites.

But small children can be carried. They can be guided. And you can help them complete it. Don’t expect “perfect”. Expect effort.

Zamzam breaks (small but powerful)

Zamzam water is a gift.

Kids often love it too. Use it as a “reset” moment. Drink. Sit. Breathe. Then continue.

Here’s a well-known dua for drinking Zamzam.

Dua for Drinking Zamzam	
ARABIC	اَللّٰهُمَّ اِنِّىْ اَسْأَلُكَ اِلْمًا نَافِعًا وَرِزْقًا وَاسِعًا وَشِفَاةً مِنْ كُلِّ دَاءٍ
TRANSLITERATION	Allahumma inni as'aluka ilman nafi'an wa rizqan wasi'an wa shifa'an min kulli da'
TRANSLATION	O Allah, I ask You for beneficial knowledge, plentiful provision, and cure from every illness.
REFERENCE	Sunan Ibn Majah (reported dua for Zamzam)

School Term Dates, Fines and Best Times for Family Umrah

This is a big UK issue.

We get asked it quietly, all the time: “Can I take my child out of school for Umrah?” The truth is, UK rules vary by council and school. Some families get fines. Some don’t. So plan carefully.

UK school absence: what we tell parents

We can’t give legal advice. But we can share what we see.

- Many schools are strict on term-time leave.
- Fines can happen, even for religious travel.
- Headteachers have limited discretion.

So, if you can, aim for:

- half-term
- Christmas break
- Easter break
- summer holidays

For general guidance on school attendance rules, you can check [gov.uk](https://www.gov.uk) and then speak to your school directly.

Best months for umrah with kids (comfort + cost)

Weather changes the whole trip.

Makkah heat can be intense, especially for small children. If you’re flexible, cooler months can feel much easier.

How long should a family Umrah trip be?

Most families do best with 7 to 14 days.

Here’s a simple way to choose:

- **7 days:** good for older kids, tight budgets, or second-time parents.

- **10 days:** a strong balance for most families.
- **14 days:** best if you want a slower pace and more rest days.

Our Sanity-Saving Packing List for Kids

Pack less than you think.

But pack the right things. That's the secret.

For the full adult + family list, use our main checklist: [What to Pack for Umrah – Complete Umrah Packing List for Men & Women](#). Below is our kid-focused add-on.

Cabin bag essentials (for baby, toddler, and kids)

These save flights and long waits.

- 2 full changes of clothes per child
- nappies or pull-ups (more than you think)
- wipes + nappy sacks
- snacks (dry, non-messy)
- small blanket or muslin
- child paracetamol/ibuprofen (check age suitability)
- plasters
- one small toy that's "new" to them

Haram bag essentials (what we see parents use daily)

Keep it light.

- folding prayer mat or small cloth
- tissues
- unscented hand sanitiser

- refillable water bottle
- dates or biscuits
- spare socks for kids (they get lost)



Clothes and shoes (what actually works)

Comfort wins.

- Breathable cotton tops
- light layers for air-con
- easy-on trainers or sandals with heel strap
- sun hat for outdoor walks

Tech that helps (without turning it into a screen trip)

Use tech wisely.

- downloaded cartoons for flights only
- Quran audio for sleep

- offline maps and hotel pin saved

FAQ



Can you take kids to Umrah?

Yes, you can take children to Umrah. Many UK families do it every year. The key is planning around naps, meals, and short walking limits. Also pick a hotel close to the mosques. That one choice changes everything.

Is umrah with kids hard with a toddler?

It can be hard, yes. Toddlers struggle with crowds, sleep changes, and long walks. But it's still doable with the right set-up. Aim for a close hotel, use a stroller plus a carrier, and do Tawaf at quieter times.

Do children need to wear ihram for Umrah?

If a child is doing Umrah, they enter ihram (the sacred state). For boys, that often means the two white cloths. For girls, it's modest normal clothing. Young children aren't held to the same level as adults, so keep it gentle and simple.

Do kids need an Umrah visa?

Yes, children need valid permission to enter Saudi Arabia, just like adults. The exact visa route depends on your passport and the current 2026 rules. Many families use an eVisa or an Umrah visa via an agent. Can I take a pram into Masjid al-Haram?

Often yes, but access can vary by area and crowd levels. Strollers are usually easiest in courtyards and wider paths. During busy periods, staff may direct you to different routes. Bring a baby carrier as backup, because you will need it at some point.

What age is best to take children to Umrah?

Many parents find ages 5 to 10 the easiest. Kids can walk more, follow basic rules, and understand short explanations. Babies can be fine too, but it's physically demanding for parents. Toddlers are usually the hardest stage, so plan extra rest.

Can I take my child out of school for Umrah from the UK?

Some families do, but it can lead to fines depending on your local council and school policy. Term-time leave is often restricted. If you can, travel in half-term or school holidays. Always speak to your school early and keep your plans clear.

Do children perform tawaf and sa'i?

Yes, if they're doing Umrah, they do Tawaf and Sa'i. Small children can be carried, guided, or pushed in a stroller where allowed. Don't expect them to be focused for the full time. Expect moments of calm, then moments of fuss.

Where do families stay in Makkah?

Most families aim to stay as close as possible to Masjid al-Haram. With young kids, a “short walk” on Google can feel very long in real life.
